I had never thought that consecrated life was for me. While in college I simply planned to be a Spanish teacher.

However, my experiences in the summer of 1999 left a lasting impression on me.

That summer I had my first extended exposure to men radically consecrated to the Lord. They were the Servants of the Word, an international ecumenical brotherhood based in Michigan. While I was living in their summer household they trained me in evangelization and prepared me for a brief time of mission work in Mexico.

When I returned home in the fall, something had changed. The life and

career I had planned for myself no longer seemed to promise fulfillment. Two years later, while serving as a missionary in Costa Rica, I finally discovered what God had been saying to me all along: "I want

you exclusively for me."

After wrestling with God about this, eventually I was convinced it was for real. Upon returning to the U.S., I began to look seriously into the Brotherhood of Hope, the community I had known for years from my family's involvement with the People of Hope. These brothers seemed to be men who were manly, hard-working, holy (and yet funny), and fully dedicated to the Church. As I pondered God's invitation, I

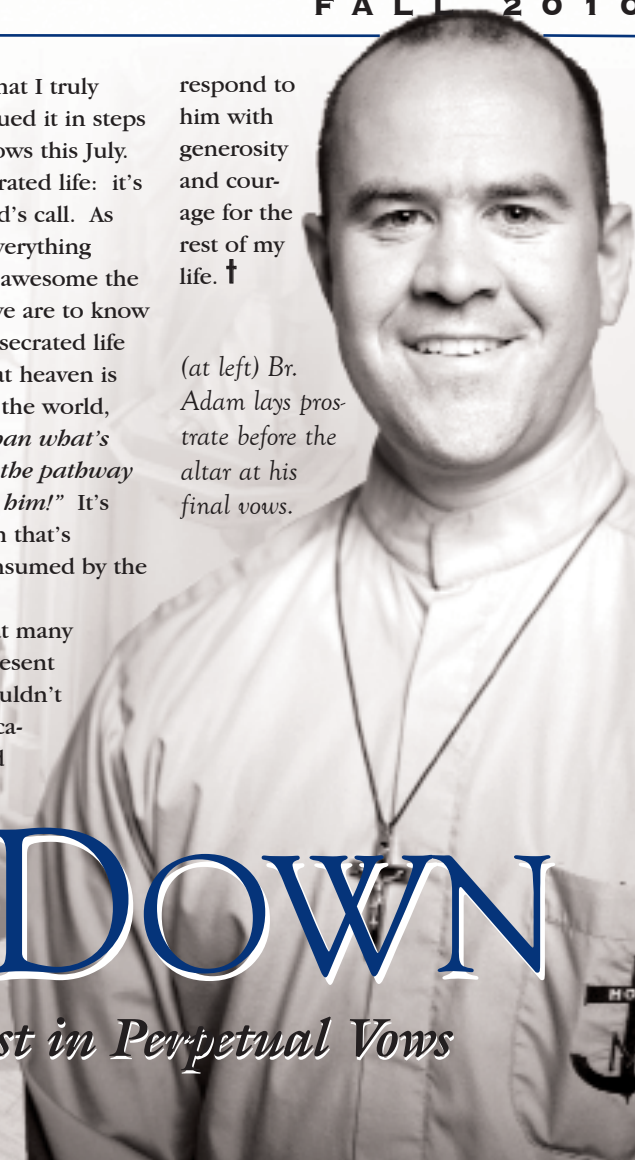
came to realize that this is what I truly wanted for my life. So I pursued it in steps which led to my perpetual vows this July.

I love the heart of consecrated life: it's a radical response to the Lord's call. As brothers we gladly give up everything because we have tasted how awesome the Lord is and how privileged we are to know him. But there's more. Consecrated life bears witness to the truth that heaven is real! It's a signpost saying to the world, "Look! There's more to life than what's simply happening here, and the pathway to that 'more' is Jesus. Go to him!" It's possible to live a life on earth that's impelled, motivated, and consumed by the love of Christ.

So looking back, I see that many signs of my vocation were present throughout my life - I just couldn't see them at the time. My vocation is a grace from God, and by that same grace may I

respond to him with generosity and courage for the rest of my life. †
